<p>Give to the Most High as he has given to you,  and as generously as you can afford.  For the Lord is the one who repays,  and he will repay you sevenfold.  Do not offer him a bribe, for he will not accept it  and do not rely on a dishonest sacrifice;  for the Lord is the judge,  and with him there is no partiality.  He will not show partiality to the poor;  but he will listen to the prayer of one who is wronged.  He will not ignore the supplication of the orphan,  or the widow when she pours out her complaint.</p>

<p>Jesus told this parable to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous and regarded others with contempt: "Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. The Pharisee, standing by himself, was praying thus, 'God, I thank you that I am not like other people: thieves, rogues, adulterers, or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week; I give a tenth of all my income.' But the tax collector, standing far off, would not even look up to heaven, but was beating his breast and saying, 'God, be merciful to me, a sinner!' I tell you, this man went down to his home justified rather than the other; for all who exalt themselves will be humbled, but all who humble themselves will be exalted."</p>
